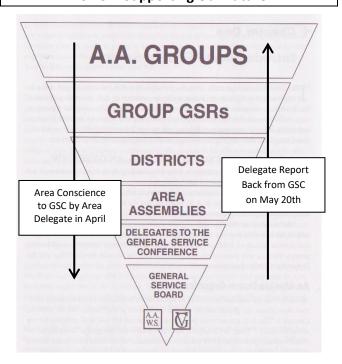

Maryland General Service, Inc.

67th General Service Conference – April 22nd – 29th Theme: "Supporting Our Future"



The 67th General Service Conference will be held April 22-29 in Rye, NY. There will be 134 members participating in the Conference this year. Final Agenda items are available today. This year, I will serve as the Chair of the Conference Finance Committee. I received a Thank You letter to the members of the Area from the Conference Coordinator for the \$3,000 budgeted contribution towards the Delegate expenses to attend the GSC.

General Service Board Quarterly Meeting ~ 1/30/17

- Following the Trustees' Finance & Budgetary Committee recommendations, the GSB approved the 2017 GSO budget reflecting a net profit of \$398,000. GSO anticipates negative results in 2018 of \$250,000 and in 2019 of \$750,000, assuming no significant change in revenue or expense streams. The Board approved the 2017 GV budget reflecting a net loss of \$114,000; and the 2017 LV budget reflecting a shortfall between revenue & expenses of \$167,000 to be covered by the General Fund.
- The Board approved the theme of "Love and Tolerance is our Code" for the 2020 International Convention to be held in Detroit.
- Self-Support initiatives remain a priority for 2017.

A.A. World Service, Inc. News

A.A.W.S. Finance Summary: The unaudited financial health of our operating corporations has improved dramatically in 2016. Revenues were \$772,700 greater than budgeted and expenses were \$718,700 under budget. Contributions were \$834,900 greater than budgeted and \$781,000 greater than 2015 totals. AAWS reported a profit of nearly \$1.4 million, against a budgeted loss of \$290,000 largely due to the fellowship stepping up contributions to cover the services that we are requesting to make our 12th step work possible. Of the 13% increase in 7th Tradition self-support contributions, nearly \$400,000 was due to 1,250 more groups in the U.S. and Canada contributing in 2016 than in 2015. The average contribution by groups was essentially flat at about \$200/group. A significant portion of the 12% increase in individual contributions was due to much greater use of the Recurring Online Contributions system. Expenses have been cut dramatically as a result of GSO streamlining operations. A sincere Thank You was extended from the General Service Board to all members of the fellowship for the increased communication, participation and contributions.

<u>2016 Gross Sales through December</u>: Gross sales for 2016 of \$13,413,929 were \$293,555 (2.1%) less than budgeted, but \$693,700 (5.5%) greater than 2015.

(Gross profit from literature plus contributions was \$772,700 (4.8%) greater than budgeted and \$1,555,500 (10.2%) greater that 2015)

☐ Total operating expenses: \$15,415,815

(\$718,700 or 4.5% under budget)

□ Contributions: \$ 7,934,900

(this was a record, up \$834,900 (11.8%) greater than budgeted and \$780,700 (10.9%) greater than 2015)

□ Net Profit: \$1,464,625

(it is noteworthy a major portion of the variance between actual and budgeted dollars is the result of current unfilled staff positions at GSO)

Contributions Financial Summary for Area 29

The 2016 Year End Area and District Contributions to GSO Reports were sent to DCMs recently. These should be provided to GSRs to share with their group as it gives them an opportunity to discuss the importance of the 7th Tradition, self-support, and be sure their group contributions are recorded accurately.

Area 29 showed a 10% increase in group contributions to GSO for 2016 with total group contributions of \$96,224. This translates to **43.29%** of all the groups in Area 29 contributing to GSO last year, as compared to 40.94% in 2015. A Huge Thank You to all the groups that contributed in 2016!

<u>GV Financial Report</u>: For the year ended December 2016, Grapevine realized a net profit of \$144,000 in comparison to a budgeted net loss of (\$146,000). For the first time in years, there was an increase of 2,100 subscriptions. 2017 Grapevine budget reflects a net loss of (\$114,000). A \$.50 increase in GV book prices announced effective 3/1/17. Organization-wide support continues to be vital for continued Grapevine printing.
